THIS TOY 1/43RD SCALE STUDEBAKER ANNIVERSARY TOY MODEL IS HISTORIC IN THAT IT WAS ACTUALLY CASTED IN A FORMER STUDEBAKER PLANT IN 1999 BY THE WELL KNOWN STUDEBAKER TOY MAKERS THE "SHROCK BROTHERS ". THE MODEL IS STAMPED AS NUMBER 1 ON THE CHASSIS AS THE FIRST ONE MADE. (THE BUILDING WAS THE FORMER STANDARD SURPLUS BUILDING IN SOUTH BEND, IN.)

ONLY 100 EXPRESS GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY RESTYLED RETRO STUDEBAKER TRUCKS WERE CASTED IN THIS STUDEBAKER PLANT BUILDING DURING THE MAY 1999 NEWMAN AND ALTMAN STUDEBAKER INTER-NATIONAL SWAP MEET. THESE TRUCKS BEAR THE DESIGNATION "SB" TO VALIDATE THAT THE MODELS WERE CAST IN THE HISTORIC PLANT BUILDING OF STUDEBAKER. (if you look closly to the chassis photo the small silver spot is where the number # 1 appears as first model casted) ophe

THE MODELS WERE CASTED IN THE STUDEBAKER BUILDING AND THE CASTINGS WERE TAKEN BACK TO THE SHROCK BROTHERS SHOP IN COAL PORT , PA. WHERE THEY WERE ASSEMBLED AND SHIPPED TO PRE-SALE CUSTOMERS

OWN A PIECE OF STUDEBAKER HISTORY WITH THIS ANNIVERSARY PICK-UP MODEL IN BEAUTIFUL GOLD NETALLIC PAINT AND DEATAILED WITH RED & SILVER WHEELS , PLASTIC WINDOWS, STUDEBAKER ON THE TAILGATE AND DETAILED CHASSIS COMPONENTS. INSIDE THE CAB IS A VERY DETAILED DASHBOARD AND STEERING WHEEL.

1935 Shrock Bros. Models

The bottom two models on the front cover - a 1935 President convertible and a 1935 Commander roadster - were built by the Shrock Brothers. David wrote the following background story about the origin of the models.

The elegantly styled 1935 Studebakers offered many mechanical innovations including independent front suspension, over-drive transmission and four-wheel hydraulic brakes with automatic hill-holder.

Shrock Body Shop has restored two rare 1935 Studebakers for Bob and Paul Yale of Wilkesboro, N.C. The first car was a Canary Yellow Roadster, which was featured in the 1985 movie "The Color Purple." The Shrocks have just completed the second car, a special bodied 1935 President Four-Door Convertible in Verlaet Metallic. This is the only 1935 four-door convertible known to exist in North America. The car will be displayed for the first time at the 1999 Studebaker International Meet.

The Canary Yellow 1935 Commander Roadster introduced the 1/72 scale line of Shrock models in 1994. The President Four-Door Convertible, the Four-Door Land Cruiser and the Business Coupe were added the same year to complete the line of 1935 models.

Model E-2K Pickups

One hundred E-2K Express Golden Anniversary pick-up trucks were cast in the Studebaker Plant Building #58-53 during the 1999 Newman and Altman Swap Meet. These models bear the designation SB to validate that the model was cast in the historic plant building in South Bend, Indiana.
